

BCAF Readiness:

Blue carbon potential for community-based conservation and mangrove restoration

Tañon Strait Protected Seascape (TSPS), Philippines

The project aims to grow local environmental conservation and community development by creating a pathway to monetize blue carbon credits. Revenue streams will support the enabling conditions necessary for the future creation and maintenance of a type of financial vehicle to maintain and conserve mangroves, expecting to incentivize mangrove conservation and support the communities.



Localize & Setting Expectations

- Trust and accountability
- Set expectations clearly
- Timing of communication is crucial
- Clarify processes for project development and time for returns









Good Governance

- Institutional arrangements is complex and different across countries and municipalities.
- Strong governance mechanisms are community-centered
- Power dynamics around ownership and use



Beyond Carbon

- **Prioritize "co-benefits"**: Coastal resilience, food security, alternative livelihoods
- non-carbon market approaches or blended solutions.
- Enabling conditions (e.g. Mapping)
- Capacity building
